LAST WEEK: Darryl Mills

Darryl, a scientist with CSL, is one of over 7,000 employees developing and marketing blood products, such as anti-venoms and vaccines to treat and prevent serious medical conditions.

He told us the Australian Government established CSL in 1915 to meet local bio-pharmaceutical needs in a country isolated by world war.

The first influenza vaccine was produced in 1918 to combat the "Spanish Flu" pandemic, and is manufactured using eggs as incubators, with 'Fluvax' being initiated in 1968.

By August 1923, Darryl said, CSL was producing sufficient Insulin for Australians suffering diabetes, and we now also have anti-venoms against all dangerous snakes and spiders;

CSL Australia was the first country to provide penicillin to civilians.

Darryl reminded us that influenza is mainly spread through inhaling spores from people coughing, sneezing or by germs picked up on hands; it occurs in humans, animals and birds with some cross contamination, i.e. the recent pig flu.

Previously, and recently, Darryl worked at Berne Biotech, the Swiss Serum Institute in Berne, and also spent several tours of duty at Adimmune, a small manufacturing facility in Taiwan.

Darryl, accompanied by his wife Barb, was made welcome by all present, and he said they would like to become Friends of Rotary. Darryl's most interesting and informative address resulted in many questions from members and guests.

An emphasis was placed on poverty alleviation, health concerns, literacy and education, and promoting the Family of Rotary.

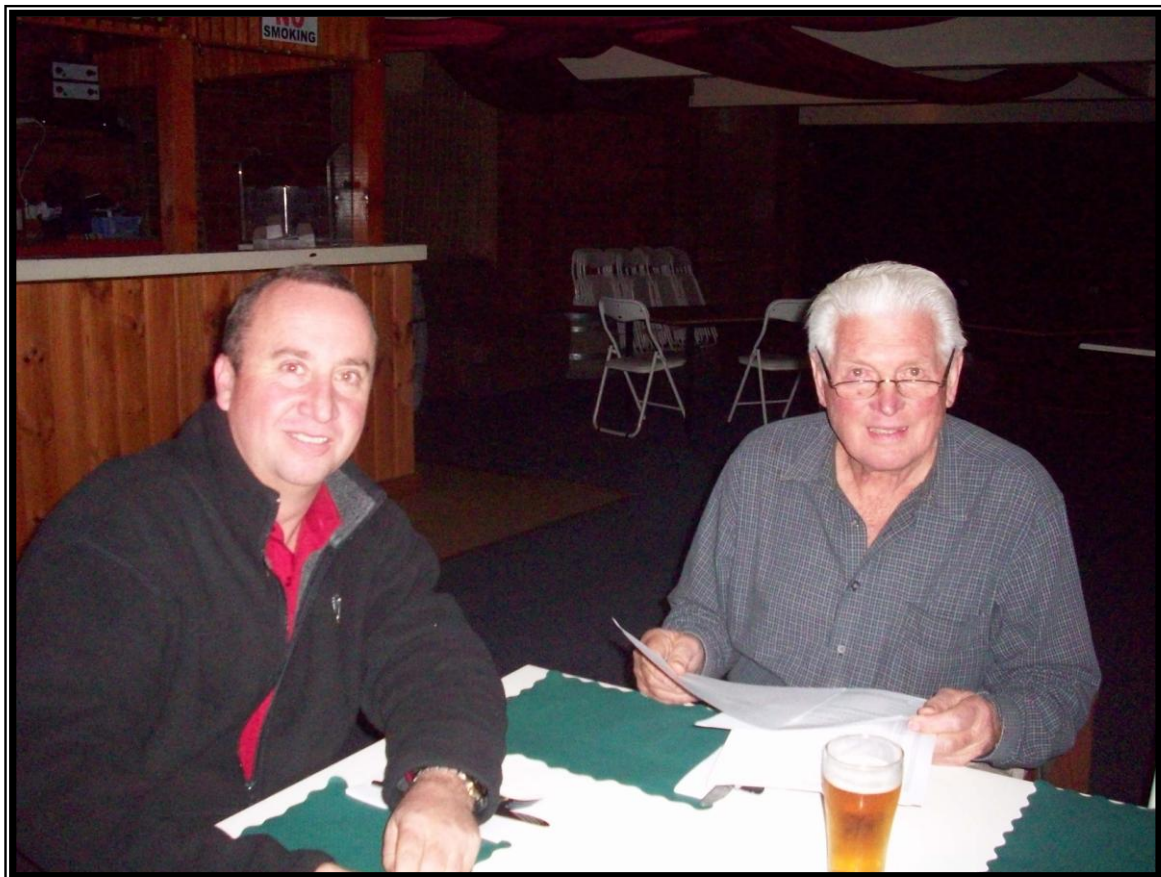
Rotary celebrated its Centennial on 25 February 2005.
